As put beautifully by our Vice President, 'Come soar as the Hawks do with Sandgate Theatre'.



Ian & his wife, Christine went home and the family talked him into going. He got the part of the 'Holy Ghost' in "What We Need Is A Golf Club" directed by Margaret Straight winning 3 or 4 trophies on the Festival Circuit. Over the years he was Vice President, Treasurer and President (for 3 years). He worked behind the scenes, doing anything that was required. He loved being on stage playing the English gentleman and had a great comedic sense of humour. Even though he got very sick in 2000 he still enjoyed coming to rehearsals. He died in November 2013. He will be greatly missed, particularly by the love of his life, Christine.
